All contributions will be exhibited at either Cabinet or MASS MoCA. Please note that we cannot return your contribution. You can, however, pick it up at the end of the exhibition if prior arrangements have been made.

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ENTERING THE CONVERSATION

REGINE BASHA

Art is a gift ...

To speak of brotherhood as the first law does is to affirm a trust in the circulation of the gift.¹

This is an exhibition about Sol LeWitt and not about Sol LeWitt. Whether or not it is even a curated exhibition is an open question. In fact, the open-call model I chose for it is a challenge and a risk to the curatorial process; open calls are messy, unwieldy, and arbitrary. But given Sol LeWitt's practice of responding to each and every artwork he received — even those from total strangers — with an artwork of his own, it seemed that an open call would be not only appropriate but symbolically meaningful. I was pleased that Cabinet and MASS MoCA shared my view that this approach was right for the project: it would be our challenge to accept the hundreds of works that would come in for the exhibition, just as LeWitt himself had done so diligently in his own exchanges.

Within the given one-month submission window, Cabinet received what might be called a "flash mob" of contributions via mail, email, and in-person drop-offs. Since the call was announced in *Cabinet* magazine no. 37 and through e-flux (as well as sent to LeWitt's friends and colleagues), responses came from around the globe. Drawings, paintings, sculptures, poems, memento mori, videos, books, photographs, soundworks, postcards, letters, musical scores, recipes, instructional works, food, drink, clothing, quotes, stories,

performances, and other indescribable items arrived and all had to be catalogued and documented.

In most cases, the guidelines were met; in other cases, they were somewhat "negotiated." By the end, we had amassed what could be called a LeWittian collection of curiosities, an idiosyncratic temporary archive, or simply a portrait of the artist through his fans. Despite the fact that we were not officially exchanging anything (except for a copy of this publication), submissions poured in, full of heartfelt thank-yous and anecdotes recalling encounters with LeWitt both intimate and accidental. Is any other conceptual artist so deeply beloved?

A visit to Sol LeWitt's private collection inspired the somewhat "irrational thought"² that ultimately led to the show. Janet Paschall, the collection's longtime curator, showed me a slide presentation of works in the collection, many of which were acquired through exchange. What was most striking was the range of work; I witnessed high conceptual art alongside amateur and folk paintings, a clear testament to the ethos of generosity to which LeWitt remained committed over the course of his long and productive career. Paschall's comment that "it's interesting to see what people thought Sol LeWitt would like" stayed



with me for a long time. I began to consider posing that question as a discursive, curatorial premise. It's possible that the germ of this project actually goes back more than ten years, when a graduate advisor told me in response to my thesis on drawing: "You have to deal with Sol LeWitt." Given the monumentality of the artist's body of work, how exactly do you "deal with" him? This project allowed me to enter a conversation around the culture of Sol LeWitt through what one might call the minor histories that intersect with it. I did not want to create a sentimental homage to the artist as much as to create an exercise for and of the artist — one that engaged with his work and modus operandi as an artist more fully than any statement about it would. For this reason, it could not be curated in any conventional sense; it could only be set into motion.

As the collection of objects and ephemera accrued, a number of themes endemic to LeWitt's practice rose to the surface. His relationship with Eva Hesse was honored in a number of works (Annie Farrar, Cedar Tavern Singers, Maritza Ruiz Kim); the early "Sentences on Conceptual Art" were reconsidered (Luis Camnitzer, David Schafer, Mauricio Limon); and instructional drawings and diagrammatic schemes also featured (Seth Cluett, Rose Shakinovsky, Lucy Lippard, Clement Valla). The show included musical scores inspired by his drawings (Manuel Sosa, Steve Roden, Walter Hekster); collections of books, poetic indexes and books with odd lists (Dan Levenson, Bruce Altshuler, Ian MacTilstra, Pablo Helguera and Jeff Eaton, Hyo Myoung Kim, Craig Leonard, Sal Randolph); and works that engaged with performance (Stephanie Diamond & Adia Millett, Hope Ginsburg, Kanji Ouellette) and with LeWitt's murals (Max Goldfarb & Alyson Strafella, Teresita Fernandez). Some of the more eccentric contributions included a wisdom tooth from Joelle Nadeau; a stuffed animal from David Ingenthal that had once been a crew mascot during the creation of a LeWitt mural; and Hope Sandrow's Hudson Valley chicken coop based on a LeWitt parallelogram.

And of course dozens and dozens of works recalled the obsessive repetitive lines and cubes for which LeWitt is best known. To our great pleasure, we also received submissions by entire art classes that took on this project as an assignment, including groups from New York's School of Visual Arts; the University of Georgia; the Rhode Island School of Design; a school in Porto Allegre, Brazil, and even an elementary school from LeWitt's hometown of Chester, Connecticut. There were also countless mailed postcards and letters — some even addressed to LeWitt directly.

In short, entirely different art worlds came together, generations mingled, and vastly conflicting styles and aesthetic disciplines blurred at the edges. It was as if a parallel, democratic art world had formed, with LeWitt its absent — yet still vibrant — center.

anonymous fabrication impose a distance between the artist and the realized artwork. The role of the artist is thus transformed from maker to connector. This connection between Missionaries and conception was made clear by LeWitt in his article "Conceptual Art or Conceptual Art," published in June 1971 as *Artforum*. Here LeWitt clarified ideas rather than their physical instantiations, and he accepted unruled concepts as works in their own right. And as concepts became the focus their linguistic expression was admitted as an artistic form. Artworks could be embodied in statements, and a collection of statements could constitute an exhibition.

The move from conceptual work to conceptual exhibition was made by dealer/publisher/organizer Seth Siegelaub, who had organized Douglas Riehle's *Assorted*, 1971 (Lachman exhibition), Bruce Nauman and Hockle's show in the form of a reading room. Here Hockle's pieces—open-time instructions impossible at any one time or place—appeared as verbal descriptions, maps and other documentation. The next month Singlaub published Lawrence Weiner. *Summons*, not explicitly introduced as an exhibition but clearly functioning that way. Weiner's works were presented in written form—"Two minutes of spray paint directions, two minutes of a reading of a spray can" (fig. 4)—and they each specified a certain process that could be carried out in the world. Whether his instructions ever were carried out, whether the work actually was physically realized, was a matter of indifference to Weiner, who left that decision to the "receiver." In January 1972 Singlaub mounted his next famous exhibition in an unrented office on East 23rd Street in New York, yet even here the catalogue was fundamental. For while the exhibitions known as *The Price* were displayed in physical spaces given to Robert Barry, Sol LeWitt, Hockle, Judd, Nauman and Lawrence Weiner, Siegelaub insisted that the grouping was primary: "The exhibition consists of the ideas communicated in the catalogue; the physical presence (or the works) is supplementary to the catalogue."

SOL LEWITT REVISED

1. Conceptual artists expand the limits of knowledge. They leap to conclusions beyond those limits.
2. Rational judgements repeat rational judgements.
3. Irrational judgements expand and enrich rationality.
4. Formal art deals with packaging.
5. Irrational thoughts should be followed absolutely and logically. This generates new irrational thoughts, etc.
6. If the artist changes his mind midway through the execution of the piece he compromises the result and separates himself. Better to finish it quickly and move on to the next.
7. Artmaking is always in danger of being amateurish. If it is, it's purely therapy and otherwise useless.
8. When words such as painting and sculpture are used, they connote crafts and not art, thus placing limitations on the artist who would be reluctant to make art that goes beyond these limitations.
9. The concept and idea are different. The former implies a general direction while the latter is the concrete. Ideas implement the concept.
10. Ideas can be works of art; they are in a chain of development that may eventually find some form. All ideas need not be made physical.
11. Ideas do not necessarily proceed in logical order. They may set one off in unexpected directions, but an idea must necessarily be completed somewhere before the next one is formed. Incompletion is a form of completion.
12. Every work of art that becomes physical there are many more important variations that do not.
13. A work of art may be understood as a conductor from the artist's mind to the viewer's. Ideally it should also be understood as a conductor from the viewer's mind to the artist.
14. The words of an artist to somebody else and from somebody else to the artist may induce an idea chain, even if they don't share the same concept.
15. Since no form is intrinsically superior to another, the artist may use any form, from an expression of words (written or spoken) to physical reality, equally.
16. If sentences are used, and they proceed from ideas about art and address them, then they are sentences on art.
17. All ideas are art if they are so intended.
18. One usually understands the art of the past by applying the convention of the present, thus anachronistically misinterpretating and appropriating the art of the past. That makes all art contemporary.
19. The original art should be altered by subsequent works of art.
20. Successful art changes our understanding of the conventions by altering our perceptions.
21. Perception of ideas leads to new ideas.
22. The artist cannot imagine his art, and cannot perceive it until it is complete.
23. One artist may not perceive understand it differently from the artist(s) a work of art but still be set off in his own chain of thought by that misconception.
24. Perception is subjective.
25. The artist may not necessarily understand his own art. His perception is neither better nor worse than that of others.
26. An artist may perceive the art of others better than his own.
27. The concept of a work of art may involve the nature of the piece and/or the process in which it is made as well as its meaning.
28. Once the idea of the piece is established in the artist's mind and the final form is decided, the process is carried out blindly but not deafly. There are many side effects that the artist cannot imagine but which he should listen to. These may be used as ideas for remaking the work, discarding it, or for new works.
29. The process is mechanical and should not be tampered with. It should run its course until there is critical distance.
30. There are many elements involved in a work of art. The most important are the most obvious.
31. If an artist uses the same form in a group of works, and changes the material, one would assume the artist's concept involved the material. Then the form should be revised.
32. Bad art cannot be rescued by beautiful execution.
33. It is difficult, but not impossible, to bring up a good idea.
34. When an artist learns his craft too well he becomes its servant, makes slick art, and smells it.
35. These sentences comment on comments about art, but are not art.

Just stop thinking, worrying, looking over your shoulder, wondering, doubting, fearing, hating, hoping for some easy way out; struggling, gasping, confusing, itching, scratching, mumbling, bumbling, grumbling, hambing, stumbling, rambling, rambling, gambling, rambling, scrunching, scrunching, hatching, hatching, hatching, moaning, grunting, hosing, hosing, horse-shitting, hair-splitting, nit-picking, piss-trickling, nose-sticking, ass-grunting, eyeball-poking, finger-pointing, alway-smacking, long wailing, small stepping, evil-crying, back-scratching, searching, perching, besmirching, grinding grinding grinding away at yourself. Stop it and just DO!"


"From your description, and from what I know of your practice, the work you are doing sounds very good! Davis is crazy like machines, larger, better, real monstrous! That we nonsense. Do more. More nonsensical more crazy, more me penses, cans, whatever—make them absurd with nonsense thing inside you, your 'weird humor.' You belong to the us. Don't worry about cool, make your own cool. Make point if you fear, make it work for you—draw and paint your fear as worrying about big, deep things such as 'to decide on a purpose'—a consistent approach to even some impossible end or even an imagined one— you must practice being stupid, dumb, unthinking, empty. Then you will be able to DO!

"DO's are drawn and decorated and very large. I have much confidence in even though you are tormenting yourself, the work you do is very good. Those BAD work. The worst you can think of and see what happens but let everything go to hell. You are not responsible for the world—just responsible for your work, so do it. And don't think that your work has to be something special, it can be anything you want it to be. But if life goes on, you if you stopped working then stop. Don't punish yourself. If it is so deeply ingrained in you that it would be easier to stop than continue, then stop. But if it is so deeply ingrained in you that it is much better,"

In her entry for April 14, the day LeWitt was writing the above, says: "I will give myself time, as I might well soon be on my sketches list scribbled on a 1965 machine drawing includes "Tupperware, pipe or rod, rubber hose, stove pipe, sand, and test card." In letters to Rose Goldman she said her "machine drawings" were "like outer space artworks" and on April 3 she was working on a "three-dimensional contraption. Not finished yet but it is weird not machine-like but weird." On April 16 she "worked all day and night, had fun"; and on April 27, she finished *An Ear in a Pond* (fig. 48). This seems to have been the time when she trucked down to work and began to realize that the three-dimensional "contraptions" were really leading her somewhere. On May 4 she wrote Rose that she was "working like crazy. First we cannot take home our work I don't think. Transporting would be very expensive. . . . My things might be transported but also will see. If really good can have gallery take them here—will see. Here one completed. I will describe. Am working on







I don't know about it's meaning and it's story lies on the procedure of it's own production.
For my participation in Tinynoise festival, last October, I got two Staalplaat Soundystem LP made for Yokomono that I was experimenting real time during my performance, this is, I was listening for the first time and using the lock grooves combining them with pre-recorded sounds I had already edited.
I enjoyed the result and the loops inspired me to use them as a structure for further tracks. I recorded some mixes and then edited, creating a sequence to which I added a parallel layer made of field recordings of various sources.
It's analog and digital, improvisation and control, processed real time experiments.

An Exchange with Sol LeWitt

While looking at the Sol LeWitt: A Wall Drawing Retrospective exhibition at MASS MoCA this summer, I was particularly drawn to the pieces like Wall Drawing 413, or Wall Drawing 1211, that emphasized the variation possible within a tight constraint of four patterns of lines or four colors. I kept wondering how these drawings would sound when played by someone on a guitar, or better yet, several people playing them on guitars. As minimalistic works of music, this performance would be a wonderful voicing of Sol LeWitt's concepts.

AN OPEN LETTER TO SOL LEWITT & FRIENDS, 10/2010

Dear Mr. Sot-Schmitt, I write to you today concerning *Lots Von Tiers new film Antichrist*. Have you seen it? If you haven't I won't bore you by recounting the plot, though, you should know that all the official trailer for *Antichrist* - and some of Lars Von Tiers' own descriptions for the film are inadequate and misleading. I suspect that one could describe the film as being "a psychological thriller that evolves into a horror film." And according to the official trailer, the plot concerns a couple who have been married for 20 years. They have suffered from many broken hearts and lawsuits, though, mature takes its course and marriage goes from bad to worse.¹ But all of these unkindness, rather conventional readings, however misses the point. The miracle of *Antichrist* is not so much the explicit narrative that more or less holds the incongruous elements together, but rather the total lack of excess within what is often referred to as "narrative" - a homeostatic, balanced, near-perfect. New Age Gods mollifying earth - that is, it is introduced. I don't want to get into too much detail, but for my interpretation of the film, the Hegelian dialectic between the two extremes of nature and culture, the nihilistic dimension of nature. There is the Hegelian philosopher Hegel's *Zug* again on the topic: "Hegel... towards the end of the chapter concerned with these realms, proposes in a Schellingian mood - is doing speculative hypothesis that perhaps animal life, in Aristotle unknown ways, aware of their lack, of the 'poorness' of their relating to the world - perhaps there is an infinite possibility of becoming, of self-realization, of self-expansion, of self-development, of self-actualization, and of self-realization of world-being in every way possible, than a kind of pain and suffering would have to pass through the whole animal realm and the realm of life in general."² I hold in a Schellingian mood, because Schelling wrote about the "Intrinsic妙理性" of all living nature, about how there is an infinite path and coveting in nature, since nature is caught in an unresolved tension, tension from within, unable to "reach" or "define" itself - which is why he called the organic tagline "the struggle for existence". In other words, an eagle can easily become the independent, rational animal, but it is also the eagle that is constantly being driven to the infinite pain and decadence of living nature, or rather, of its unresolution, if it is allowing nature herself to be constantly thrown, towards, and away from the emergence of logos on its determination." Lots Von Tiers, in a surprisingly modest move, takes and runs with this Hegel/god/kafkaesque/Schellingian model and tries to add his own speculative whims/hypotheses that perhaps logos and language (and even psychotherapy itself) aren't necessarily wrong, cannot not respond to the infinite paths and tensions of nature. This is the reason why even with all of his claims and logic, and good protestations Dorian is a ultimate enigma in order to keep us from understanding Goliath.³ What if the spoken word is simply another mutation of this unbearable tension? I watched *Antichrist* with my friend, the video/performance artist Gina Clark - and the very moment in the film that the idiosyncratically evil fox mouthed the words "Chaos reigns," to Wimber Dolce, she meekly shot that in pants and ran out of the room immediately. I was shocked. This is not just perfect place for a film like *Antichrist*, but it is also perfect for us, dear self - as though we are originally created in the image of God, but then lost our way. It is precisely here [while we are at the end of the provisoally open letter, a shamanic, apocalyptic thinking-out-loud session] that I want to apologize; for I have not yet tried to get to the really serious and ready topics. If you weren't aware of it already, the point of the writing exercise was to provoke you into met. Are you aware that *Antichrist* additionally proposes a quiet challenge not only to its characters, but to us? But even to you? So Let's start specifically! And don't worry about the status of the work, but the status of character in the film. The question is, does the character of Dorian, and the character that personifies logos is indeed instant, and reply isn't the repeating feature, but guess what? Chaos is. Cinema can do what Minimalist-inspired art (Doris Lessing's *The Ark* and pencil drawing on paper likeemic) Poesie #11 (1981) can't do: on effectively make derivative cheapo can not only redeem us - it can also act as the aesthetic exception to the rule. The reason is that cinema has right - the right to be a little bit messy, a little bit chaotic, a little bit perverse, the unpredictable, the random, etc. etc. The contrary is that, of course, of other movies, that are made by a moral woman who intentionally features her child and tortures her husband is plainly misogynistic and inherently antiethic - except this one, the film is not simply an example of avante-garde cinema; it is the Madie-Schiffer that transcends the countless series [of the misogynistic elements belonging to the universe]. I urge all conceptual artists: Please watch the movie. If you haven't already, and tell me what you think. According to Judd Fink: "It was not amodity, but a masterpiece."⁴ I am not sure if I agree with him, but I am sure that I am not the only one that has a positive point and in von Tiers hands cinema becomes暮氣 (I was wondering if others have written it). How do you like it? Is it misogynistic? Am I a misogynist for saying it is a commodity? It is a commodity? RECIPE FOR SOL LEWITT

INGREDIENTS

Water
Bouillon Cube

METHOD

The success of this recipe rests on your ability to follow instructions. Start by exchanging 'idea' for 'recipe' and 'art' for 'meal', so that the idea recipe becomes the machine that makes the art meal.

Once you are comfortable with this practical alteration and you are willing to follow irrational thoughts absolutely and logically, begin by filling an exceptionally large pot with water. Bring to the boil. Add a bouillon cube – stirring diligently as the cube dissolves. The meal is now more or less inevitable.

You must now reduce, reduce, reduce. The bare essentials are desirable, and you are doing well if the process has been ludicrously simple thus far.



Remain cooking until the meal has been resolved. Remember that the work meal is a permanent installation until it is destroyed eaten.



Margin of error (An Exchange with Sol LeWitt).2010. This is an unlimited/unrestricted 'instructional' work owned by whoever comes across it.

The Work

A4 copy paper in landscape format is rolled up to make a cylinder whose diameter is determined by the two short edges of the copy paper meeting.

Instruction

Rolling one sheet at a time, add paper to the previous sheet (this repeat action contributing to the growth of the cylinder's diameter).

This repeat rolling action continues until the two short edges of the paper meet determining the cylinder's final diameter (fix in place with double-sided tape).


The pragmatic and mechanical nature of the work though simple, does need to be executed with sensitivity and precision. However, this said, it is to be expected that there will be a human touch and individual tolerance in evidence and that nuance and incident will emerge. Perhaps it is this 'margin of error' between an idea, and its realization, that is the location for what we call art and the poetic.

a glissando:
• that has a minimal, almost imperceptible slope.
• that starts and ends at the midpoints in time of two sustained tones with the same duration (at most half the duration of the glissando); the first of which ends and the second of which begins in unison with the glissando.
• with a midpoint in pitch that is equidistant to two (other) sustained tones with the same duration (at least three times the duration of the glissando); the first of which ends and the second of which starts at the midpoint in time of the glissando.

the entrances of the sustained tones are preferably accented with percussive attacks that decay slowly and the exits are preferably accented with percussive attacks that are punctuated.
